CANNING THORACIC INSTITUTE EXPANDS INNOVATIVE TREATMENTS



Northwestern Medicine launched the <u>DREAM (Double Lung Replacement and Multidisciplinary Care) program</u> in March after the second successful transplant for patients with late-stage lung cancer. Dr. Bharat and the team removed both cancerous lungs and replaced them with healthy lungs, reducing the risk of cancer cells contaminating the new organ or other body parts.

Using lessons learned from the COVID-19 pandemic, Northwestern Medicine also launched a <u>lung failure training program</u>. The program started with our community hospitals in IL. Contact us for more information on bringing this training to your country.
